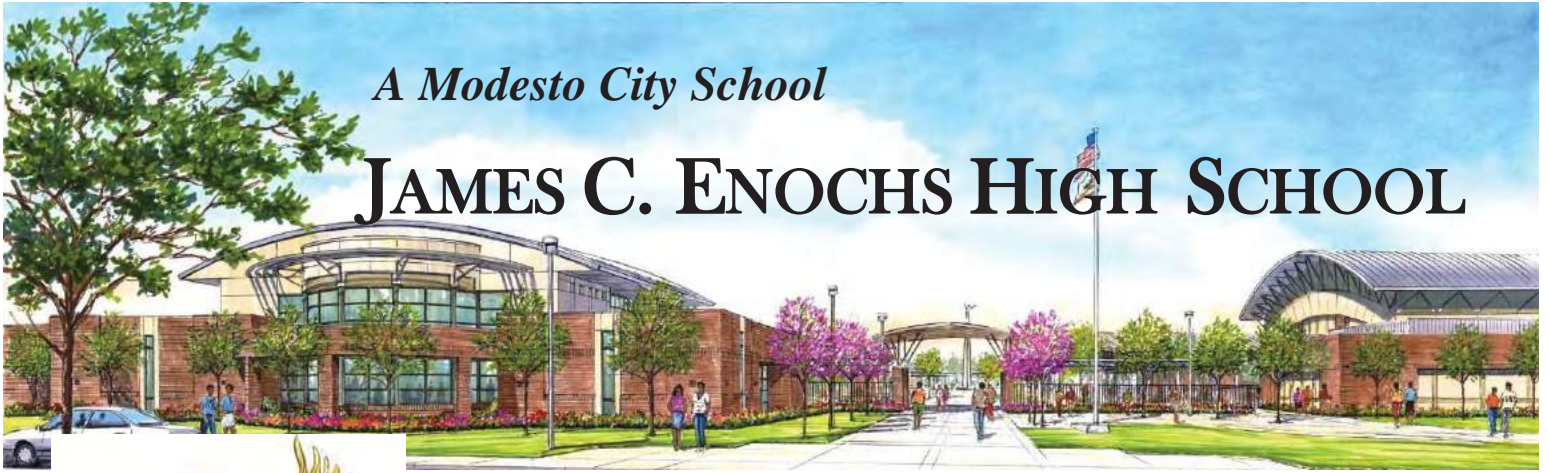

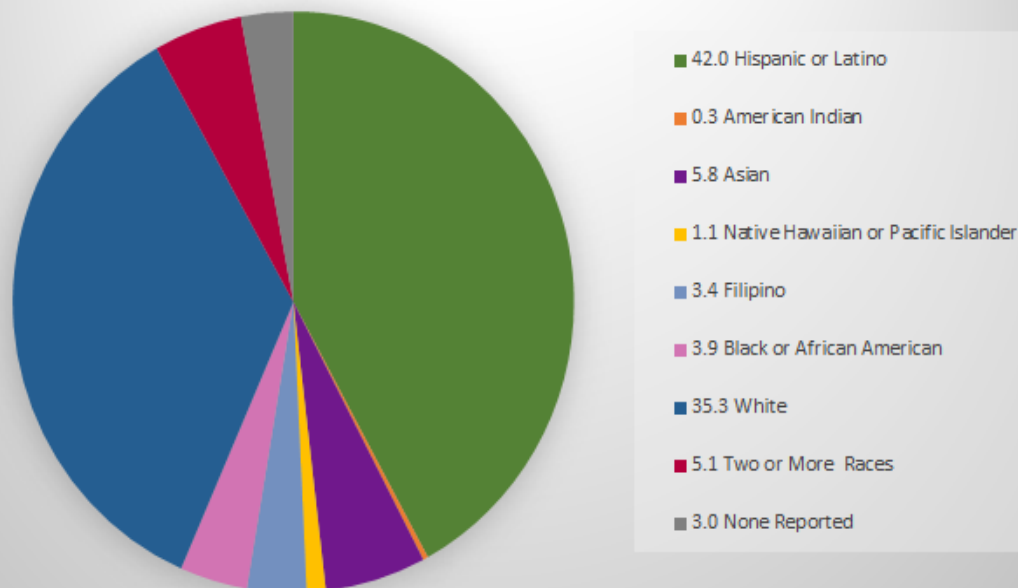
Our vision presupposes a community in which academics, athletics, student activities, and the arts contribute to student success.

Enochs is located in the heart of the Central Valley in northern California. Agribusiness is the most prevalent industry in the area. Enochs has 106 certificated staff members, of those, 15 have a Master's Degree and 3 have a Doctorate degree. Our student to counselor ratio is 600-1 and we also employ a full-time college counselor who assists students in meeting their college and career goals.

In the second year of the new CAASPP test, 77% of Enochs students met or exceeded the standards for English Language Arts. In Mathematics, 42% of our students met or exceeded the standards set by the state of California. We were the highest performing high school in our district for the second year. **CLASS RANK**

Senior unweighted rank is determined by the cumulative unweighted GPA that is based on grades 9-11 and all classes including P.E. Weighted class rank is determined by the weighted GPA that is based on grades 9-11, and all classes including P.E., with an extra point for honors and AP courses in which the student earned grades of A, B, or C. Some students rank could be lowered because of taking optional periods for band, leadership, or sports.

**GRADING SYSTEM AND SCHEDULING**

Enochs operates on a seven period (49 minutes) day, with two lunch periods. Students may opt for a zero or an eighth period class from limited offerings including computer literacy, marching band, jazz band, P.E., or leadership classes. The grading system for all classes is based on a five step scale: A-Outstanding, B-Above Average, C-Average, D-Below Average, F-Failing. Grades are determined by student achievement relative to the objectives of the designated instruction level and the teacher.

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## College Acceptance and Matriculation Class of 2017

**86%** of the class of 2017 intends to pursue post secondary training at four-year or two-year colleges and universities, **43%** will attend four-year universities, **43%** will attend two-year colleges.
