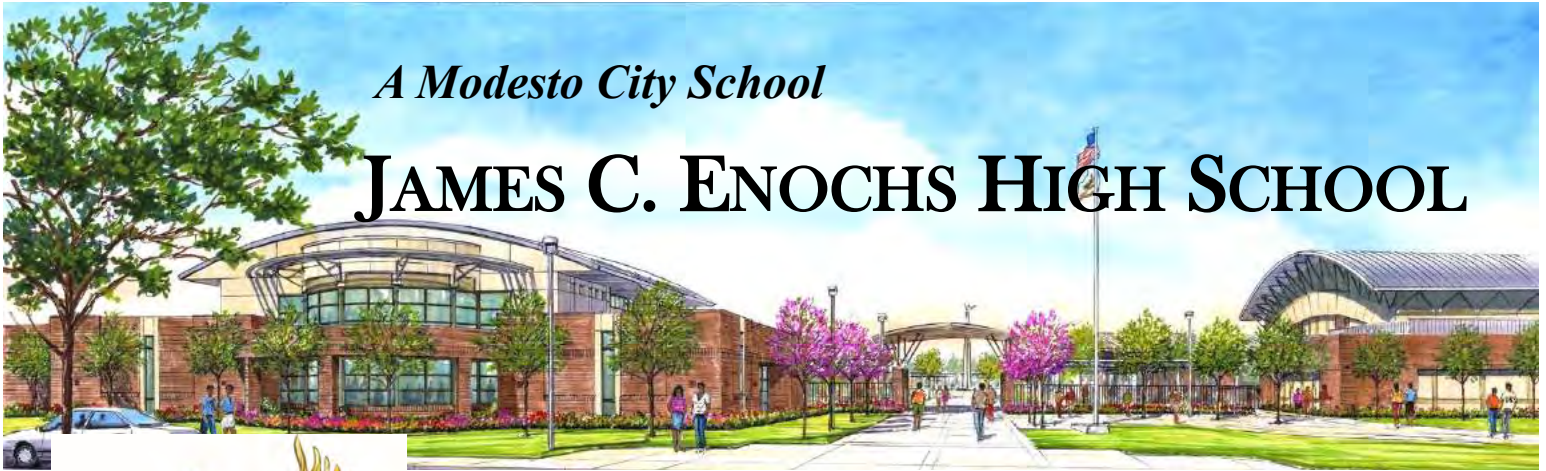

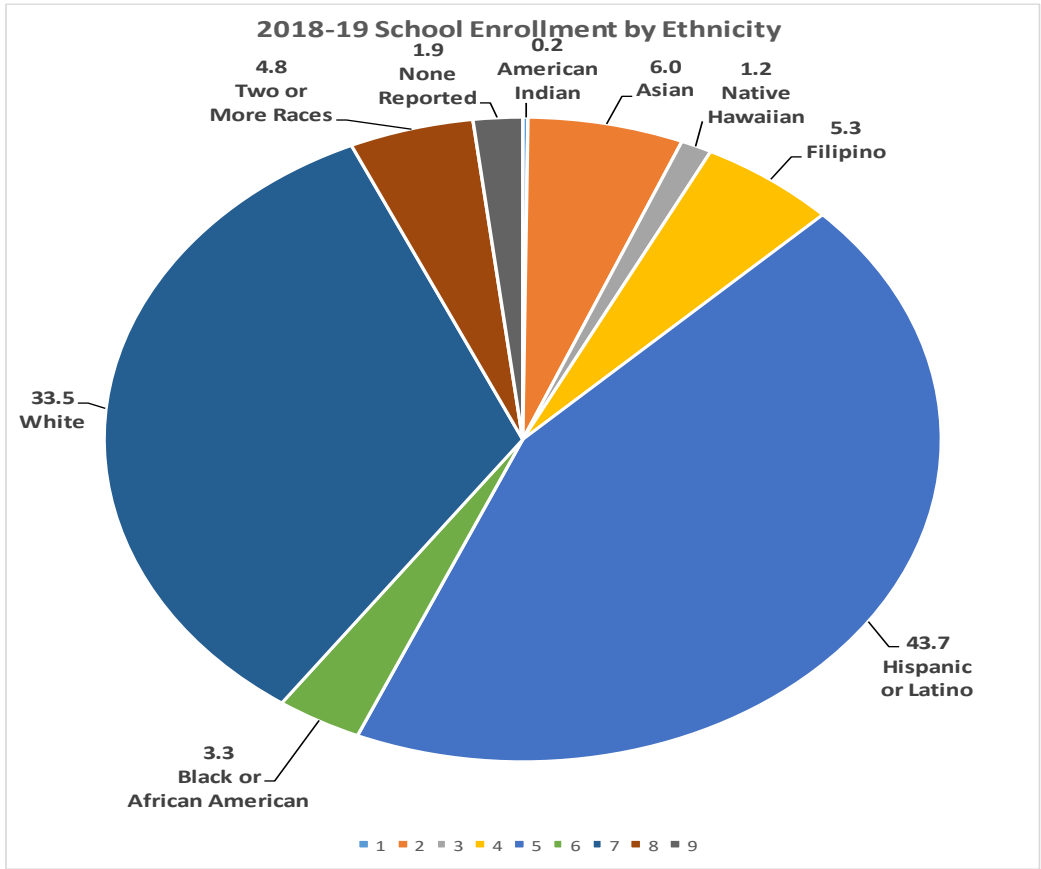

James C. Enochs High School was established on August 28, 2006 and is one of seven comprehensive high schools in the Modesto City School District. The majority of our 2,377 students in grades 9-12, reside in the northeast section of Modesto. Our goal for the students at Enochs High School is to develop successful students by providing top quality instruction within a safe, responsible, respectful culture. Enochs is located in the heart of the Central Valley in northern California. Agribusiness is the most prevalent industry in the area. Enochs has 106 certificated staff members, of those, 15 have a Master's Degree and 1 has a Doctorate degree. Our student to counselor ratio is 650-1 and we also employ a full-time college counselor who assists students in meeting their college and career goals.

Smarter Balanced Baseline Test 2018

For the Smarter Balanced state test which is taken in the junior year, 60% of Enochs students met or exceeded the standards for English Language Arts. In Mathematics, 32% of our students met or exceeded the standards set by the state of California. We were the highest performing high school in our district for the fourth year.

GRADING SYSTEM AND SCHEDULING

Enochs operates on a seven period 50 minute day, with one lunch period. Students may opt for a zero or an eighth period class from limited offerings including computer literacy, marching band, jazz band, P.E., or leadership classes. The grading system for all classes is based on a five step scale: A-Outstanding, B-Above Average, C-Average, D-Below Average, F-Failing. Grades are determined by student achievement relative to the objectives of the designated instruction level and the teacher.

CLASS RANK

As of the 2018 school year, our students are ranked by decile instead of number rank. Additionally the top 5% of students are identified on the transcript. Senior un-weighted rank is determined by the cumulative unweighted GPA that is based on grades 9-11 and all classes including P.E. Weighted class rank is determined by the weighted GPA that is based on grades 9-11, and all classes including P.E., with an extra point for honors and AP courses in which the student earned grades of A, B, or C.
